



What is One Health?

It is an integrated unifying approach that seeks to balance and improve the health of people, animal and ecosystems in a sustainable way.

The Alianza One Health Selva Maya (AOHSM) is a platform for regional dialogue to improve the health of the Selva Maya.

What does the AOHSM do?

- Facilitates synergies between actors and sectors
- Supports the dissemination of knowledge, research results and lessons learned
- Provides a venue for cross-sectoral dialogue

Who are the members of the AOHSM?

Members are individuals and public institutions, community leaders, non-governmental organisations, and academia. Participants come from the biological, biomedical, anthropological, human health, (wildlife) veterinary, social and environmental sciences.

The members are organised in self-managed working groups with the following thematic focus:

- Water, Air and Soils
- Zoonotic and Vector-Borne Diseases
- Monitoring and Surveillance
- Academia and Research
- Traditional and Local Knowledge

What does the AOHSM aim to achieve?

The Alliance strives to integrate traditional forms of knowledge and science-based approaches to arrive at inclusive recommendations.

The specific objectives are:

- 1 To integrate and incorporate One Health solutions in the implementation of the Estrategia Integral Selva Maya 2030 for a resilient and healthy Selva Maya

- 2 Improve the well-being of the population, the environment and fauna of the Selva Maya
- 3 Bridging the gap between science, communities, policy and implementation
- 4 Improve epidemiological surveillance and early response
- 5 Foster a regional One Health identity

The AOHSM promotes an inclusive approach that respects cultural identity, indigenous peoples' rights and identity, and diverse forms of knowledge and practices, including traditional epistemology.
